While our Solo program has been providing tons of fun thanks to our dedicated Solo Committee it is time to think about the on track experience provided by Cincinnati Region's big race weekend this year. Performance Driving Experience (PDX) is a great way to get that hot streetcar or racecar of yours (or your good friend's) on track at Mid Ohio. The I.T. SPEC*tacular does not require you to be Microsoft® Certified. It is our restricted double regional with all the track time you could want.

We all need to do more to reach out to that member/past member/competitor you haven't talked to for awhile and invite them to our well-respected event. I'm serious - it is incredibly important we get those old racecars out of the garage even if you have to volunteer to help get it ready to go. Split the cost and share the car with each of you doing one day of the regional.

Keep in mind if your license has inexplicably lapsed, our own region member Bryan Floyd is the divisional licensing steward and can help you to re-qualify for your competition license, but it is important to get started as soon as possible. SCCA licensing policies are in place to help you get your credentials back without the hassle of the past.

The PDX is a perfect chance to get to test your high performance car with an experienced driver/instructor on the world renowned Mid Ohio Sport Car Course without the fear of a ticket and the unbearable increase in insurance costs that come with it. Unlike previous years, instructors this year will have only one novice so there will be more instruction and less searching for that instructor that was out with another novice in the previous session.

PDX's are not an all out competition event but a chance to safely drive your regular or high performance car near its limit. Passing is limited to a few straightaway sections and only with a point-by by the driver you are overtaking. The other advantages of a track day are everyone is going in the same direction and the safety barriers are much better in the rare event you would lose control. We have had nearly 300 cars on track in our previous events and we have had only a couple of incidents involving only the one car in each so the risk is minimal.

Once again, we really need your help to get folks out to our event. Invite that guy or girl at the, office, plant, car show, shopping mall, street race, with the sporty car and enjoy the "FUN". All that is needed to drive in the PDX is a driver's license, helmet, long sleeve shirt and pants and a desire to have fun. Oh yeah, no open top cars without an SCCA approved roll bar.

Solo Nationals Newsletter - May Edition

- A reminder that registration is open and the cost: \$135/person, \$180 with waiver for anyone not attending a 2009 Tour or Divisional event. After August 14, the entry fee goes up to \$270, so don't delay registering.
- The Monday night welcome party will be from 5:30 p.m. 10 p.m. and will be hosted by the Smith Collection Museum of American Speed and the Lincoln Convention and Visitors Bureau. All attendees are invited to partake of the food and festivities which include a tour of the museum. For a sneak peak visit www.museumofamericanspeed.com.
- Overnight Parking/Camping is allowed at the Lincoln Airpark. The cost is \$40 and registration is located on the National Championship webpage.
- The host hotel is the Embassy Suites located less than 10 minutes from the event site. We do have a special rate of \$109/night and a link for registration is on the National Championship website. We recommend making hotel reservations early, as the Nebraska State Fair and a University of Nebraska football game will be occurring at the same time as the National Championship and ProSolo Finale.
- The new site location brings a new look to the banquets. Wednesday and Friday night will be reception-style, allowing competitors to mix and mingle prior to entering the hall for the awards ceremonies. Food will be plentiful. All competitors will receive one (1) drink ticket that may be redeemed for beer or wine after that it is a cash bar. Additional dinner tickets may be purchased on site or by calling the Solo department at 800-770-2055. The cost is \$20/Adult and \$10/child (10 and younger). This is a reduction from last years pricing of \$25/\$15.
- Downtown parking at the Embassy Suites may be a challenge for anyone attending the Awards Ceremonies with their rigs in tow. But don't worry! The City of Lincoln has arranged for off-site parking and shuttle transportation to and from the hotel. Parking will be provided free of charge at the University of Lincoln baseball complex security will be provided to watch your vehicles beginning at 4 p.m. on Wed and Fri. Return shuttles will run until 10:30pm. After that you will need to walk or call a taxi. The host hotel is located within walking distance of The Haymarket District a hot bed of food, drink and entertainment. Expect to be asked at Paddock Check-In if you will be using the shuttle service we need a head count to give to the city.
