Minutes of the November 18, 2008 Meeting of the Cincinnati Region Sports Car Club of America

Board members in attendance were Bill Niemeyer Jr., E.B. Lunken, Chipp Swindler, Kurt Niemeyer, Todd Cholmondeley, Jerry Cabe and Brian Walker. Also in attendance were David Santel and Andy Stanford.

The meeting was called to order by Bill Niemeyer Jr.

On the motion of E.B. Lunken, with Brian Walker seconding, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

In the treasurer's report, David Santel told the board that the region's financial records were complete through the end of the previous treasurer's time in office. He is trying to complete the data entry required to be current, and that he hopes to be caught up by December 1.

Todd Cholmondeley gave the race report. The race committee met November 10 to discuss the 2009 season. The committee is considering various race groups, as it is possible that the Formula Ford East/West Challenge will not participate at our event due to Formula Ford 40th Anniversary being held at Road America the week prior to our race. The committee has invited GTA (a stock car series recognized as a regional class in SEDiv, NEDiv, and MIDiv) to run at our race.

In the PDX report, Todd told the board that Dave Howard has volunteered to chair the PDX at Mid-Ohio. Brian Walker volunteered to chair the event at Blue Grass, which will consist of a PDX on Friday and Saturday, followed by a Time Trials on Sunday.

Andy Stanford gave the solo report. He informed the board that he has discussed with the Ohio Valley Region the possibility of conducting a divisional championship at Kings Island. He asked the board about the possibility of instituting a solo rookie of the year award. On the motion of Brian Walker with Kurt Niemeyer seconding, the board approved the creation of such an award, with Andy to establish the criteria.

On the motion of Chipp Swindler, with E.B. Lunken seconding, the board voted to have the 2009 annual banquet at River Downs on January 17, 2009. The cost will be \$50 per couple, \$30 per individual, with groups over two paying \$25 per person. Paul Williams will be the event chairman.

On the motion of E.B. Lunken, with Kurt Niemeyer seconding, the board to approve the expenditure of up to \$2,500 to support the attendance of the membership chairman and three others to attend the SCCA national convention.

The board decided to have the board meetings begin at 6:30 in the future with the general membership meeting continuing to be 8:00.

Jerry Cabe distributed to the board copies of the current region constitution and by-laws, a retyped version, amendments that he has suggested, and a copy with those amendments incorporated.

On the motion of Brian Walker, with Jerry Cabe seconding, the board approved the expenditure of up to \$400 to purchase a canopy and have the required stenciling done of a canopy to be used at region events.

On the motion of E.B. Lunken, with Jerry Cabe seconding, the meeting was adjourned.

At the membership meeting the following officers were elected for 2009: RE- Bill Niemeyer Jr.; Assistant RE-E.B. Lunken; Treasurer-Dave Santel; Secretary-Kurt Niemeyer; member-at-large-Bryan Schafer, Andy Stanford, and Chipp Swindler.

Making Tracks


Kurt Niemeyer Bluegrass Motorsports Park

One of the most exciting parts of the weekend at any track event is the first time "cars on course" is called over the network. We now have cars on course at Bluegrass Motorsports Park. The 2.5 mile west course has the base layers of pavement in place and cars are permitted to circulate the track at highway speeds. For those of you that will ask if race speeds will be higher I will point out now that the speed restriction is a function of the liability insurance during construction rather than pavement composition or engineering. When we start racing we will be going faster, well most of us will be going faster-there will always be backmarkers.

The participants in the Lexus Rivercenter Rally to the track were the first group to drive around the wholly paved track. The Ohio Valley Asphalt crews were working that Saturday to get the job completed. It was a beautiful although cold day for the rally. The route is a blast with many of the things that make such a drive fun; the route even included an "ice hazard" provided by a leaking water delivery truck in a driveway! Of course, the truck was parked on a curve on a hillside making the yard-wide swath of ice even more fun for the participants. Several Cincy Region members came out for the event, the cars were spectacular with Roush and Saleen Mustangs, Audi R8, Nissan GTR, a Lexus IS 250 with a load of "goody go-fast" parts and several IS-Fs entered. The Lexus IS-F is a four door hot rod that is a blast to drive on the track and will get you to the grocery and back with speed and style! Thanks to Ken Kocher and Lexus Rivercenter for hosting this fun day. Ken is an SCCA member with racing experience in Showroom Stock C and Escort World Challenge cars.

Bill Niemeyer Sr. has added Bluegrass Motorsports Park to his resume of tracks he has driven very early in their existence (Mid-Ohio, IRP, Meadowdale, Willmot Hills, Road Atlanta, Nelson, Louisville Fair Grounds and others). 


10 Years Ago in the "CinChronizer"

Seven drivers made the trip to Topeka for the Solo II Nationals. Kumar Viswalingam finished 14th of 40 in B Stock, Jennifer Schneider was 5th of 11 in B Stock, Jim Zeisler 14th of 33 in D Stock. Jack Burns 8th, Mike Ruff 25th and Dave Bettis 40th of 47 in G Stock. Ray Thomas 15th of 30 in C Mod.

Nine drivers competed in the SCCA Runoffs® at Mid Ohio. B.J. Zacharias was 1st in Formula Atlantic and winner of the Mark Donohue Award.
