Bluegrass Road Course

Bringing Racing to your Neighborhood

The Bluegrass Road Course and Motorsports Club is moving ahead at a terrific pace. Many of you have asked about specific location of this new track and motorsports facility; it is located off US 127 between I-71 and The Ohio River. If you drive on I-71, the track runs adjacent to the expressway at mile marker 64. If you look to the north-west you can see the construction.

The excavating is taking place and the track is taking shape on the undulating terrain that will make this one of the most challenging courses in the country. To check out the location on the www.DriveBluegrass.com website, click on "contact us" and then the "location" button. The option of accessing Google Maps comes up on the left side; here you can see a terrain map, get driving instructions and other information.

The track President, Brad Poppell, and Operations VP, Andy Vertrees, are working on the construction crews to keep the pace up and not lag behind schedule; checking on a satellite imagery site this author could clearly see both men at the site talking to the equipment operators. Zooming in I could see that Brad had several pages of technical data and some plans that appeared to be automotive based. Adding audio to the satellite feed picked up the conversation very clearly; they were giving the operators tips on how to upgrade the equipment to run like an Audi R10 LMP1. They offered to bring in Biodiesel Fuel if it would make the equipment run faster and get the job done quicker. There was some discussion of getting Frank Werner, Dindo Capelli and Tom Kristensen to show the fast way and how to put all that Caterpillar torque to good use in getting off the corners faster. With the local connections to the all-conquering Champion Audi LeMans Team this could be a viable plan to get the job done.

All seriousness aside, the activity at the track is at a fever pitch with the many details of bringing a project like this to fruition. Membership information is available on the www.DriveBluegrass.com website. Cincy SCCA long time member Kurt Niemeyer has joined the Bluegrass Team (see article below) and will be glad to answer any questions about the track and how you can enjoy this fabulous new facility in the tri-state. Personal and Corporate memberships are available and club dates are coming in 2009.

The Road Racing Course is set to open in the spring of 2009. Brad Poppell and Kurt have offered the Cincinnati Region a premiere date in May for Club activities and WOR SCCA has scheduled the annual WOR Games Regional Races on their traditional late season dates.
