INAUGURAL GLD CLUB TRIAL

The Cincinnati Region, as well as several other regions within the Great Lakes Division, has held Performance Driving Experience (PDX) events for several years. The Sports Car Club of America PDX (Level 1 of the four-tiered Time Trail program) provides individual instruction and track time to develop the skills and experience for performance driving. This is generally accomplished on a road course under strict safety rules. Individual timing of the PDX event is prohibited to allow a safe environment for learning, not competing.

On Saturday, July 28th, the Cincinnati Region held the first Club Trial to be put on in the Great Lakes Division. The Club Trial is Level 2 of the Time Trial program, and is the next step in the development of performance driving skills. While very similar in logistics and execution to the PDX, the Club Trial adds timing to the mix. A transponder is added to the participant's vehicle in order to allow recording of individual lap times.

The Club Trial event was held in conjunction with Cincy's IT/SPEC*tacular weekend. The Club Trial was scheduled as Group 8 of the Saturday race event, and had 15 participants. Most had driven in the PDX on the previous day, so they all were familiar with the course and the logistics the event would operate under. The Club Trial participants all received a 20-minute morning session to prepare themselves and car, and to run their best "qualifying" lap time. These best times were used to set the grid for the afternoon session, and allowed the best opportunity for the participants to have clean track time in order to concentrate on applying their driving skills. Both Club Trial sessions were run with only two minor spins on track.

For some of the participants, their AM lap times were better than their PM times. This is likely to have been a function of the atmospheric conditions (hotter in the afternoon). But most showed lap-time improvements between the two sessions. But in the end, all the participants for the inaugural Club Trial had big smiles on their faces.

A second Club Trial is scheduled by the Neohio Region at Nelson Ledges on August 19th, and the next PDX is scheduled at Mid-Ohio on August 31st by Ohio Valley Region. With all the new faces we had more than one lost driver looking for the tech barn, false grid or the party Saturday night. Thanks to all that got these wayward folks where they were going.
